#### **EDOMI Discernment Process**

- Importance of Clergy Support and Involvement at the beginning of the process.
- Moving to a Competency Based Approach
- EYSJ is still normative but no longer strictly mandated

#### **INITIAL STEPS**

- A Call is sensed or named
- 2. Individual meets regularly with Clergy about Call (Clergy may recommend EYSJ) \* If a person is at a congregation that does not have a rector/vicar/priest-in-charge please contact the Canon for Congregational Development, The Rev. Ellen Ekevag <a href="mailto:eekevag@edomi.org">eekevag@edomi.org</a>.
- 3. Individual continues to invest and be an active leader in the congregations
- 4. Once the clergy and individual agree that further discernment is needed, they submit the Inquirer Packet to the Bishop's office.

### Clergy Sponsor Letter

- 1. Compelling Faith: How has this person shared their faith with you in compelling and real ways?
- 2. Self-Awareness and Openness to Growth: *In what ways has this person in conversation with you demonstrated that he/she/they are open to growth?*
- 3. Vocational Awareness and Community Affirmation: Which holy order (priest or deacon) is the inquirer most interested in discerning at this moment? And why?
- 4. Leadership in Context: In what ways has this person been engaged and ministering in your congregation or faith community?





- 3. What questions are you taking with you into your Community Discernment Committee?



#### Other Resources to Use in Initial Conversation


- 1. Discuss their prayer and spiritual life
- 2. Begin to ask them to take on greater and greater leadership roles in the ministry and worship life of the congregation and reflect with them on those experiences.
- 3. Have the inquirer write their spiritual autobiography and give it to you and reflect on it.
- 4. Study the Baptismal Covenant
- 5. Study the Ordination Services
- 6. Review the overall ordination process
- 7. If interested in further discernment walk through the CDC Process and discuss possible members for their CDC.

#### Introduction and Formation of CDC

#### The selection of the Committee:

- A. The Committee is to be established by the rector/vicar/sponsoring priest in consultation with the inquirer.
- B. The CDC is Composed of:
- Convener a Lay Person who will convene and organize the CDC
- 3-4 members who are communicants in good standing, exhibit emotional and spiritual maturity, and are active in the liturgical life and ministry of the congregation/community. (We suggest at least one member be from the vestry as a liaison.)
- 1-2 member(s) who are Episcopalian(s) from another worshipping community.
- Wherever possible, the committee should reflect racial, cultural and gender diversity and have an appreciation for the breadth and depth of the Anglican Tradition.

### Each Session Follows the Same Format

It is our hope that the Reflections and Guiding Questions will be helpful and insightful for not only the inquirer, but also the members of the CDC.

We hope the CDC is a chance for every member of the CDC to grow in faith and understanding

#### The Sessions

The Committee meets with the inquirer once or twice a month for about ninety minutes. The Theme for each Session are:

- 1. <u>Orientation and Commissioning (The CDC first meets with member(s) of the COM to go over the process and expectations.) CDC Forms Covenant</u>
- 2. <u>Compelling Faith Part A:</u> Inquirer Gives Spiritual Autobiography
- 3. <u>Compelling Faith Part B</u>: Inquirer Leads Bible Study
- 4. <u>Self Awareness and Openness to Growth:</u> Inquirer Leads the Prayer Practice of Examen
- 5. <u>Vocational Awareness and Community Affirmation</u>: CDC works directly with ordination services and competencies
- 6. <u>Leadership in Context:</u> Inquirer leads opening prayer with creative element
- 7. <u>Reflections and Blessings</u>: CDC Ends its time of discernment with the Inquirer
